- Designed, implemented and documented Integrated sequential arts curriculum, grades TK-5, at Title 1 school.
- Trained teaching artists to work in their artform with students with disabilities.
- Designed curricula for grades TK-5, Art for Science Teachers to increase STEAM opportunities in Marin public schools. Trained over 80 teachers.
- Utilized visual and performing arts to develop new model of community engagement for at-risk high schoolers.
- Trained teaching artists, teachers and parents in integrated arts curriculum.
- Introduced artists, teachers, and parents to arts education pedagogies: Studio Habits of Mind, Artful Thinking, Teaching for Understanding, Visual Thinking Strategies, and Making Learning Visible.
- Taught visual arts in classrooms (pre-K through grade 8, all learners) engaging art-making to aid in acquiring language and fine motor skills with young children with autism and English language learners.
- Designed collaborative Projects, working with more than 1000 school children to create large-scale public art projects.

- Created and taught curriculum for 200 children weekly, aged 2-12.
- Hired and trained staff of 15 art teachers, assistants and party leaders. Ongoing staff training (50 people in 10 years)
- Through strategic partnerships, oversaw pro bono projects for over 30 fundraising events for up to 500 children each, helping to fundraise for local organizations such as the Bay Area Discovery Museum, SF Zoo, SF Symphony, Steinhardt Aquarium and Museum of Science.

Executive Director

Non-profit, non-denominational 501(c)3 organization dedicated to improving the welfare of children and their families in rural Zambia, providing women with microloans, giving them a jumpstart in initiating their own income-generating project.

- In 2013, helped locals to open the BBYC Center for the Survivors of Gender-Based Violence, the first such center in the entire region.
- Launched micro-loan program in remote village that has provided loans to over 200 women since June 2011
- In 2012, launched Banamayo Designs, combining artwork from vulnerable Zambian women with designs in the West to create a new funding model for Lubuto.
- In 2012, began Teen Eco Art Project, bringing computer, video cameras and movie making skills to vulnerable teens in Zambia.
- Worked with local Zambian women to found Lubuto Jumpstart Women Empowerment giving over 80 micro-grants, aiding in training and monitoring. Trained over 350 local women in basic banking, business and reporting skills. (until initiation of Loan Program in 2011)
- Oversaw design and production of all collateral media, both digital and print.
- Self-published Kashikishi Lubuto (book available on blurb.com), which has raised \$4,000, funding over 30 additional grants.
